In 2007, Caritas Connection and Catholic Community Care merged to form Catholic Community Connection, which now consists of 19 of the major Catholic health care, senior living, social services, and higher education ministries in the greater Cleveland area.

It's through collaboration with our health care partners that we seek to ensure coordination and access to health care services (and social services) for all the people of God in our midst. Our health care partners offer treatment and care options that align with the Catholic teachings and your family's values.

Options in seeking health care

While not everyone considers the religious affiliation of the hospitals or health care facilities that treat them, there are a broad range of things to think about when weighing your options:

Services offered—Do they meet your medical needs while aligning with your core values?

Location—Is the facility convenient to you and your loved ones?

Reputation—Are they known for providing quality care and staying true to their mission?

Cost—Does your health insurance provider cover services at this particular facility?

Commitment to the community—Do they care for everybody regardless of their ability to pay?

Religious accommodations—Is there an on-site chapel and/or access to clergy for spiritual, religious, and emotional support?

Established in 1865, St. Vincent Charity Medical Center was Cleveland's first private hospital. Its philosophy is rooted in the 171-year legacy of the Sisters of Charity of St. Augustine, whose ministry includes healing through direct care, outreach, and related health and human services activities.

In September 2022, St. Vincent Charity Medical Center announced it will transition from acute care to ambulatory care. As of November 15, St. Vincent Charity Medical Center will no longer provide inpatient services. Patients can continue to expect high-quality, compassionate ambulatory care as provided through: outpatient mental health services; addiction medicine services through Rosary Hall; primary care, internal medicine and urgent care.

As the first residential inpatient hospice facility in the Greater Cleveland area, Holy Family Home serves individuals who are diagnosed with any life-limiting illness and their families.

Nestled on 7-½ beautifully wooded acres in Parma, Holy Family Home is a peaceful and serene 30-bed inpatient center that is open to families 24 hours a day.

Some Holy Family patients prefer to stay at home, while others may need another level of care to manage pain or other symptoms and may feel more comfortable knowing that professionals are with them 24/7.
