Rose-Mary continues the ministry of Jesus Christ by nurturing individuals with disabilities and celebrating love, family, dignity, and faith within the community. They serve over 100 individuals each year through residential services and adult day services.

Rose-Mary's community homes are located throughout Cuyahoga County and offer children and adults with developmental disabilities an opportunity to live in a safe, home-like setting.

They are staffed by licensed professionals, including nurses and direct care staff, and provide residents with round-the-clock care, assistance with daily living skills, access to recreational activities, and opportunities for personal growth.
