Catholic Community Connection serves as a resource to all people within the Diocese of Cleveland. One important aspect of our work involves directing students and their families to higher education opportunities that are rooted in the Catholic tradition.

While founded in the Catholic faith, our educational partners welcome students of all religions and backgrounds, as well as those with no religious affiliation. Their primary goal is to offer a wide range of academic, cultural, and spiritual opportunities so that students can become well-rounded adults.

We work closely with three local institutions to create intergenerational opportunities where students can engage in internships, volunteer opportunities, and service-learning projects. On going learning programs are also available throughout the year (virtually or in person) and our collaborative 10-week Summer Fellows Program offers students a real world, paid work experience at local Catholic ministries.
